

2018-2019 Non-Traditional Student Scholarship

SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION

Western Washington University is offering a scholarship program for non-traditional students. This scholarship is funded through the WWU tuition waiver program. The Non-Traditional Scholarship (in combination with other tuition waivers) cannot exceed the cost of tuition on a quarterly basis. The scholarship will be awarded for winter and spring 2019.

SCHOLARSHIP QUALIFICATIONS

- ▶ Be a Washington State resident.
- ▶ Have financial need as defined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA).*
- ▶ Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5.
- ▶ Be enrolled at Western Washington University as a matriculated student and attending at least half-time.
(Please be aware that the Non-Traditional Student Scholarship cannot be used for Extended Education coursework, including, but not limited to, online, self-paced, TESOL, RN to BSN, recreation courses and study abroad, including faculty-led programs.)
- ▶ Be an undergraduate student (**post-baccalaureate and graduate students are ineligible**).
- ▶ Meet at least one of the non-traditional student criteria as defined on page 2 of this application.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Essay: Write brief essays about the following:

1. How will attending Western help you to achieve your academic and career goals?
2. Describe what academic success means to you.
3. Describe how being a non-traditional student has impacted your educational experience.

Supplemental Information: Provide a list of significant activities and honors. Please include volunteer activities and employment information. If you prefer, this summary may be written in a résumé style.

Transcripts: You are encouraged but not required to include transcripts from all previous colleges and universities attended. Unofficial transcripts are acceptable. Transcripts provide the committee with information about your academic achievement, progress toward your academic/career goal, academic improvement, and enrollment in other coursework that demonstrates your interests/talents. Please do not include your WWU transcript.

Fairhaven Majors: Please submit copies of all 2017-2018 faculty evaluations. If you are unable to provide all Fairhaven evaluations, please submit a written statement describing why this requirement cannot be met.

Number of Copies: Please submit **three** complete packets (which includes this scholarship application, non-traditional documentation, the supplemental information, essay, and transcripts). Please do not staple your application materials. Paper clips, binder clips or rubber bands are preferred. Separate envelopes or folders containing your application materials are not necessary and will be discarded.

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NON-TRADITIONAL CRITERIA

Please check each category for which you are eligible and submit the required documentation. Scholarships will be awarded in each category:

- Displaced Homemaker:**
Provide a detailed statement that addresses the following:
 - Your prior unpaid services to family member(s);
 - Your loss of financial support from a family member;
 - Your current employment status, i.e. unemployment or underemployment (part-time or below education/skills).

- Dislocated Worker:** In general, a person may be considered a dislocated worker if he or she is currently receiving unemployment benefits due to being laid off or losing a job and is unlikely to return to a previous occupation, has been laid off or received a lay-off notice from a job, or was self-employed but is now unemployed due to economic conditions or natural disaster. Please submit, along with your application, the following: [Dislocated Worker Verification](#).

- Delayed college enrollment:** After a *continuous five year absence* from either high school or college, a student who was admitted or re-admitted to WWU for one of the following quarters: Winter 2018, Spring 2018, Summer 2018 or Fall 2018. Transcripts will serve as documentation.

- Students with Dependents they support:** Must provide more than half of support for this person(s) as defined by IRS publications. Please provide a written statement detailing how you meet this requirement. In addition, you must submit a copy of page 1 of your 2017 IRS tax return listing your dependent(s) or, if you do not claim them on your return, please provide a statement describing your situation.

- Students with Disability:** Please provide written verification that you receive services from the WWU Disability Access Center. This documentation will be provided by the Disability Access Center upon request.

- Foster Youth:** A student who was a foster youth at any time prior to the age of 18. You must provide documentation of this status if you are not currently a recipient of the Passport to College Scholarship.

- Non-Citizen Students with HB 1079 Status:** Students who have graduated from a Washington State high school or obtained a GED (or will do so before beginning college), have lived in Washington for three years prior to, and continuously since, earning the high school diploma or equivalent and who sign an affidavit (written promise) to file an application to become a permanent resident of the United States when eligible to apply. WASFA application will serve as documentation.
